

Booth Guidelines

Earth Day Celebration

Oregon Garden

- A booth consists of a space 10' wide by 8' deep with an 8' table and 2 chairs. There will be a curtain or wall at the back of each booth.
- 2006 Earth Day participants have until March 10 to register and reserve a space. All booth spaces will be located in the Grand Hall. The exact location of your booth will be assigned by Oregon Garden staff. Traffic will be equally encouraged in all parts of the Garden.
- The topic of the booth can be anything that fits into this year's overall Earth Day theme- "**Climate Solutions**". Example topics include but are not limited to: waste reduction strategies; recycling and composting methods; re-usable energy technologies, such as solar or wind; hybrid or bio-diesel vehicles; water quality protection; biofiltration systems for gray water; rainbarrels; erosion control strategies; gardening with extreme forms of weather; climate change effects on local agriculture or wildlife; etc
- The sale of environmentally focused products and services is allowed. If you have items for sale, please include a list with your booth reservation form. The Garden reserves the right to refuse any items deemed inappropriate for the spirit of the day.
- The focus of this event is educational, not political. We ask that you focus on educating others about natural resources, and limit political activity. The public can draw their own conclusions when given good information about natural resource issues.
- Each participating group must assume responsibility for the costs of setting up their own booth.
- We strongly urge groups to make their booths interactive. We encourage you to include take-home information/items and activities that visitors can participate in to learn more about the topic of the booth. If the participating group is a classroom or a youth organization, we encourage the students/youth to share or lead the teaching responsibility.
